ALUMNI IN THE SPOTLIGHT

MAJELLA TUMANGAN-VILLAROMAN

Majella Tumangan-Villaroman once thought she would become a nun during her time at Miriam College High School, Batch 1979. Little did she know that the care and compassion she possessed would instead lead her to influence the global wellness industry.

Today, she is the President and CEO of my-CORD Corporation, a premier international provider of employee assistance programs and services for multinational clients. In 2018, she was recognized as one of the 100 Most Influential Filipina Women in the World by the Foundation for Filipina Women's Network.

Majella earned her degree in Communication Arts from the University of Santo Tomas and later pursued a Master of Business Administration in International Entrepreneurship Management at George Washington University.

Her journey as a staunch advocate for mental health and well-being was catalyzed by a tragic event in New York in 1993, when her sister—also a Maryknoller—Marita Theresa, was among six people killed on a train by a shooter suffering from mental illness. At a time when mental health was rarely discussed, young Majella was driven to understand human behavior and transform tragedy into an opportunity to promote positivity.

Coming from a background in fashion and jewelry, Majella rediscovered her purpose in championing resilience and fostering meaningful conversations about mental health in the workplace. Her career highlights include serving as Director for Global and Employer Behavioral Healthcare Initiatives at the Institute for Behavioral Healthcare and working as a lead private consultant to the International Labor Organization. Upon returning to the Philippines, she continued her advocacy through roles such as President of the Rotary Club of Manila 101 and currently serves as Assistant Rotary Public Image Coordinator for Region 11 Zone 10A of Rotary International.

One of her earliest leadership experiences was as President of the Kabataang Barangay of Brgy. Laging Handa in Quezon City during her high school years. At MCHS, she found joy in spending time in the chapel and engaging in conversations with the nuns. Majella fondly recalls reconnecting with Batch '79 through reunions, where she realized their shared commitment to academic excellence, volunteerism, and doing good. She now serves on the board of trustees of the Maryknoll-Miriam Alumni Association.

In recent years, Psychology has become one of the most pursued programs at Miriam College. For Knollers aspiring to explore the art and science of human well-being, Majella offers this advice: "Go for what you feel close to your heart, and I will be there to help and influence the environment to ensure we have enough psychologists and psychiatrists. The world is changing so fast, and there aren't enough people out there to help."

In Majella's words, a Miriam graduate is a kind, amazing, and captivating go-getter who speaks their mind with pride.

TAKBANG: TAKBO, TINDIG, TABANG

Takbang: Takbo, Tindig, Tabang advocacy run fundraiser organized by the official home organization of Miriam College scholars, Talitha Cumi, commences this morning, May 4, at the College Parking Lot, with over 200 expected runners to join the 3 kilometer run.

External Vice President of Talitha Cumi, Genelikyle Paullery Torres, opens the morning assembly program by energizing runners with a quick warm-up and reminding them of the purpose of the event, "Together, we can challenge the status quo, break down the barriers, and create opportunities for all individuals to thrive."

Takbang's beneficiary is Tahanan Sta. Luisa, Antipolo, a crisis intervention and recovery center, providing immediate shelter, care, and rehabilitation for abused and exploited street girls. Since its founding in 1997 as the Rosa Virginia Social Reintegration Center, Tahanan Sta. Luisa has successfully helped over 600 girls, currently with 10 girls under its care.

The run will have two laps, starting at the College Parking Lot, going around the HEU and High School grounds, and will culminate later at 8AM with a Solidarity Summit joined by government and student representatives to express support for the advocacy.

The event is organized by Talitha Cumi in partnership with the Organization of Diplomatic, Humanitarian and Economic Affairs (ODHEA), Miriam College CEDAW Youth Chapter, Miriam College Educators' Circle, Sanggunian ng Mga Mag-aaral ng Miriam, and the Women and Gender Institute of Miriam College. 'TAYO ANG NGAYON, SILA ANG KINABUKASAN'

After crossing the finish line, TAKBANG donors and advocates stood as one in a solidarity summit featuring addresses from partner organizations, government agencies, student leaders, and a highlight performance from singer-songwriter Nica del Rosario.

Following the 3-kilometer advocacy run, TAKBANG: Takbo, Tindig, Tabang para sa Batang Kababaihan attendees gathered at the HEU parking lot for the solidarity summit where they were able to further exercise the 'tindig' and 'tabang' components of the event held last May 4.

The first open address was virtually led by Ms. Joanna Camille Rada Jacinto-Lizardo, Public Affairs and Information Office head of the Council for the Welfare of Children (CWC), who imparted the importance of collective action and solidarity in inciting ripples of transformation. This was followed by an address on empowering Children and Youth in Street Situations (CYiSS) delivered by Mr. Michael Bismar, the country director of Asmae Philippines, a French international solidarity non-government organization.

Social welfare officer III Ms. Jill Bernice Sta Ana from the Department of Social Welfare and Development's (DSWD) Protective Services Bureau, who is a Miriam College alumna, shared the pressing issues Filipino women and children face today, and the urgent need for individuals, communities, and the government to embrace the co-ownership of child welfare and protection.

A pre-recorded speech by Ms. Ermelita V. Valdeavilla, the Chairperson of the Philippine Commission on Women, followed. "Do not just march, but run, or takbo toward equality. We must take a stand, or tindig, against injustice. And we must help, or tabang, uplift those who have been unheard for too long," she highlighted efforts toward combatting gender-based violence, which beyond physical harm, is a 'social-development issue, a global health emergency, and the most pervasive human rights violation'. Ms. Valdeavilla reminded everyone of what unity can accomplish for women and children everywhere.



The student body of Miriam College was also represented in the summit through the voice of 4th-year BAGD student Marla Keziah Cueson, Chi Rho Editor-in-Chief Karina Daniel Melencio (4th Year BAGD), and MC Educators' Circle internal vice president Hiraya Plata (4th Year BECE). They shared their insights on the advocacies and each invited the audience to verbalize their stance through calls

such as 'Ang laban para sa mga bata ay ilalaban natin nang sama-sama', 'Patuloy tayong tumindig at tumakbo dahil ang karapatan ng kababaihan ay karapatan ng sambayanan', and 'Ating kabataan, ating ipaglaban'.

CEDAW Youth Miriam College chapter President Kacey Villarena, Internal Vice President CJ Santiago, Secretary Claire Cruz, and Public Relations Officer Allana Descallar also expressed their advocacy for championing women, human rights, and marginalized voices such as that of the girls in Tahanan Sta. Luisa.

The summit was also graced by artist Nica del Rosario. She serenaded the crowd with her original song "Tahanan", and was later accompanied by third-year Environmental Planning student Candice Dangilan for a rendition of "Rosas". Shortly after a live transparency report, a song and dance performance from the street girls survivors who are in the care of Tahanan Sta. Luisa brought joy and inspiration to the audience.

Talitha Cumi moderator Ms. Sarah Jean Mariamonte then announced the top 3 finishers of the run, Rojin Ortega (255), Jernegal La Torre (131), and Johan Rafael Bahija (121), winning the prize of Pizza Hut gift certificates.

"Para sa Tahanan Sta. Luisa at milyong-milyong batang kababaihan, patuloy ang ating takbang," Talitha Cumi President Meccaela Amboy, in her closing remarks, introduced the TAKBANG movement, an invitation for everyone to continue the advocacy by pledging at least 1 kilometer of movement every 4th of the month wearing mismatched (in color) shoes or slippers as an act symbolizing solidarity with girls and women who are survivors of abuse.



She then smiled at me and told me that I was the first 5th grader she met whose writing looked like it came straight from the professional glossy magazines. That was the first time in my life that somebody told me that I was good at something, and it inspired me to be a teacher. I've been teaching for seven years now, always aspiring to be the Mrs. Delos Santos to other kids who were just like me.







MOBILITY FOR DIGNITY



Maryknoll alumni in action in 'Mobility for Dignity' wheelchair distribution program by the Rotary Club of Manila 101

Twelve mobility-impaired patients were given wheelchairs during Mobility for Dignity, a project of the Rotary Club of Manila 101 (RC Manila 101) in partnership with the Maryknoll/Miriam College Alumni Association (MMCAA) at the Philippine Children's Medical Center (PCMC) on May 30, 2025.

Mobility for Dignity serves as the signature program of RC Manila 101, a local chapter of the international service organization Rotary International. In collaboration with Wheelchair Foundation, Chair The Love, and the Philippine Red Cross (PRC), the project has distributed wheelchairs to beneficiaries in the Philippines since 2021.

The program was hosted by Ms. Majella Tumangan-Villaroman, a member of the MMCAA Board of Directors, executive director, and former president of the RC Manila 101.



PCMC medical director Dr. Maria Eva Jopson welcomed the attendees by recalling her encounters with patients who relied on their wheelchairs as they championed resilience. She then introduced Ms. Norwina Eclanal of PRC, who read PRC secretary general Dr. Gwendolyn Pang's message for the opening remarks, followed by the remarks of RC Manila 101 President Ms. Sherill Quintana.

On behalf of the MMCAA, Chairperson of the Board Ms. Elaine Urbano delivered a response highlighting how the collaboration is rooted in compassion and shared purpose, as well as their continued commitment to volunteerism through Project MMaria, MMCAA's quick response program. Attendees from the MMCAA Board included Chairperson of the Board Ms. Elaine Urbano, VP for special projects, Ms. Selina Surla-Angels, and Director Ms. Doris Granada, along with Miriam College Alumni Engagement Office director Dr. Ma. Margarita Acosta. Miriam College alumna Dr. Ma. Amparo Agrava was also in attendance as the Officer-in-Charge of the Medical Services Department of PCMC.

Miriam College president Amb. Laura Quiambao-del Rosario, in her response, spoke about the crucial role the Red Cross plays in society in providing humanitarian aid and saving lives. She also talked about the importance of civil society organizations in bringing about development assistance.

The wheelchairs were distributed after PRC staff briefed the beneficiaries on wheelchair care instructions. Several parents of the beneficiaries expressed their gratitude through short remarks. Two Miriam College HEU faculty members were among the beneficiaries.



Following the giving of certificates to partners instrumental to the success of the event, Former Department of Health undersecretary and former RC Manila president Dr. Enrique Tayag took the floor to deliver a response, and led a special dance number that got everyone in the groove.
