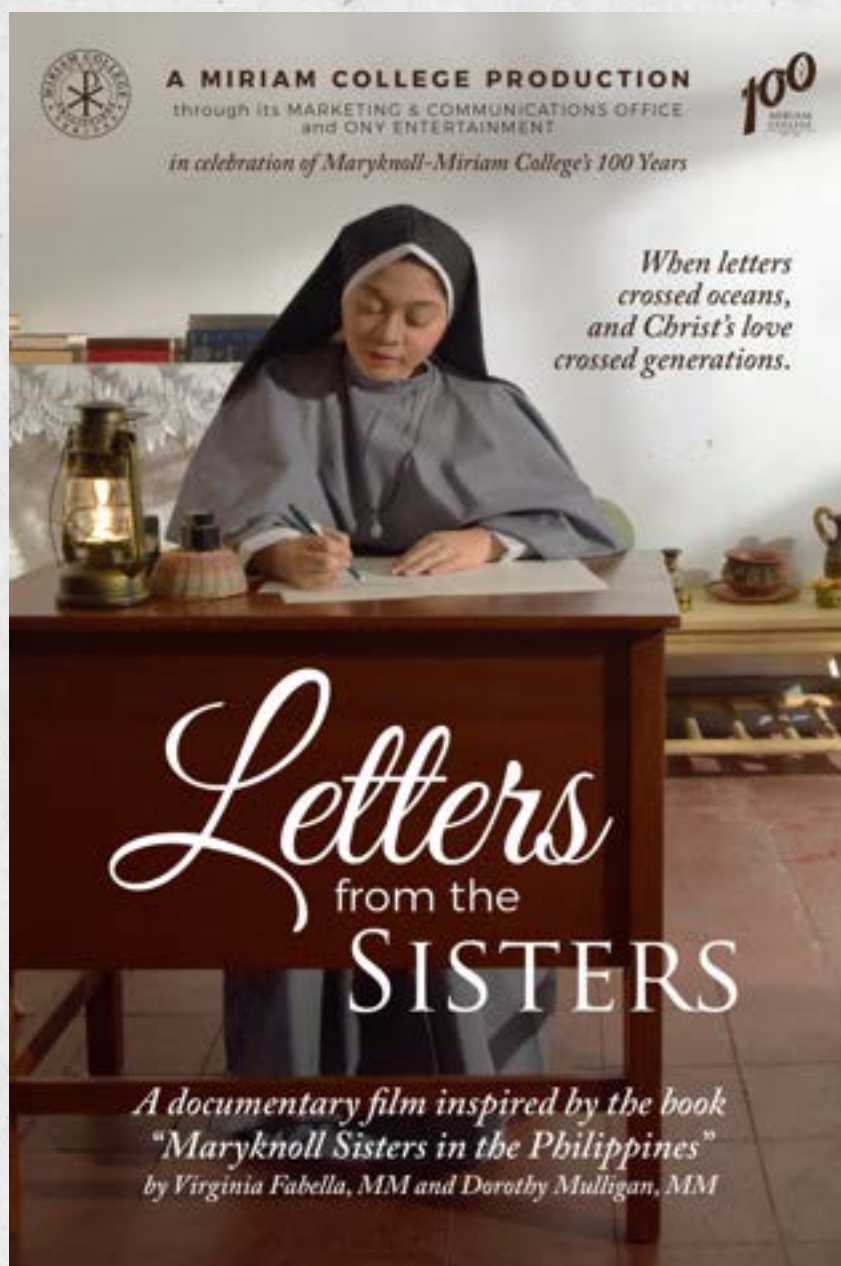

GLOBAL CAREER EXPO 2026

The opening program was hosted by Ms. Angie Alcazar, International Student Experience Coordinator of the GRPO (Global Relations and Partnerships Office). The keynote address was delivered by **Hon. Myra Paz Valderrosa-Abubakar**, Department of Tourism (DOT) Undersecretary. A proud alumna of Maryknoll Class of 1986 (BA Communication), she is a Maryknoll-Miriam Triple A awardee, and served as the 2025 commencement speaker.



Hon. Abubakar focused her address on the future of work and the evolving tourism landscape, sharing insights that resonated deeply with the student body. She noted that while work was once defined by a rigid 9-to-5 schedule, today's generation is entering a fast-paced world of remote work, startups, side hustles, and innovative paths that are redefining traditional career concepts.

Reflecting on her time at Maryknoll, she emphasized that the greatest advantage that Miriam education provides is adaptability. She also shared her humble beginnings prior to entering public service, offering a grounded perspective on professional growth.

"The future you are imagining is not as straightforward as you think. It is elusive, intangible, and fleeting," she told the students. "...The future is fluid, but it is also moldable," she underscored that fluidity also meant movement, which makes room for growth.

The undersecretary reassured students that a first job does not define a person's entire career; what matters most is constant forward momentum. She further remarked on the evolution of tourism, which now encompasses economics, sustainability, cultural preservation, and peace-building, among others. Because industries are now interdisciplinary, the modern workforce has expanded into spaces that didn't exist twenty years ago, she added.

"All you need to do is be adaptable, and this is where MC has equipped you well," Hon. Abubakar encouraged the students to thrive by focusing on lifelong skills, noting that a career is rarely a straight ladder, but rather a journey full of surprises. Finally, she reminded the audience that success is hollow without a sense of purpose.

"The future of work is you. You are the future of work."

Organized by the Office for Student Affairs and Global Relations and Partnerships Office, the 2-day expo is set to host pocket sessions.

MC STUDENTS MEET ACCLAIMED WRITER AND ALUMNA CECILIA MANGUERRA BRAINARD

On February 19, 2026, students from the Higher Education Unit (HEU) attended "On Writing, Diaspora, and Translation," a conversation featuring award-winning author and Maryknoll College alumna (Class of 1968) Cecilia Manguerra Brainard.

Hosted by Ateneo de Manila's Literary and Cultural Studies Program, the conversation with Ms. Brainard formed part of the launch of a revised and critical edition of "A Small Party in a Garden" by Linda Ty-Casper.

Eager to meet the literary icon, representatives from Chi Rho, the official student publication of Miriam College, joined the event in person. Fourth-year students from the Department of Communication also participated via Zoom as a learning engagement for their Cross-Cultural Literature class.

During the talk, Ms. Brainard recounted the experiences that shaped her journey as a writer and publisher. She spoke of being influenced by the diverse stories from childhood, not only because she was an avid reader from the start, but also as someone who grew up being exposed to folklore in Cebu.

As the conversation shifted to Ms. Brainard's remarkable political awareness as a Filipino-American writer, she looked back on her involvement in local affairs, specifically when she joined a protest in front of the Malacañang Palace as a Maryknoll student. The country's historical and political scene indeed shaped her writing, as evident in her acclaimed novel "When the Rainbow Goddess Wept" set in the Philippines during World War II.

Chi Rho writers maximized the opportunity and engaged with Ms. Brainard during the open forum, continuing the conversation on diaspora and Philippine-American literature.

INSTITUTIONAL WAY OF THE CROSS



The Miriam College community gathered last March 30, 2026, in solemn reflection for the Institutional Way of the Cross, sponsored by the Higher Education Unit (HEU), under the overarching theme *"STABAT: Standing for Justice and Peace in a World Full of Crises."*

In Miriam spirituality, Stabat is one of the Four Ways of Miriam, signifying a steadfast "YES"—a yes to being present with those who suffer, and a yes to becoming like Mary, the Mother who remains with Christ's friends in their moments of pain and need. Thoughtfully directed by Ms. Lynda Garcia and Mr. Jethro Joaquin, with creative direction led by Sir Jaerold Marc Ramos, the presentation was brought to life through the collaboration of design students and members of TKM (Teatro ng Kolehiyo ng Miriam). The activity featured powerful dramatizations, songs, and the communal praying of the Rosary, creating a deeply engaging and prayerful experience. Through these elements, participants were invited to journey with Christ in His passion and suffering, reflecting on the realities of sacrifice, injustice, and hope that continue to resonate in today's world.

This was followed by a reflection session presided over by Fr. Karel S. San Juan, SJ, President of Ateneo de Davao University and CEAP, centered on the theme *"Called and Formed to Be Prophetic."*

In his reflection, he emphasized that as prophets, we are called both to critique and to proclaim, to announce and to denounce. He also highlighted the importance of synodality—walking together as a community in listening, discernment, and shared mission—reminding everyone that the prophetic call is not lived out alone, but in communion with others. This call challenges us not only to speak out against injustices, but also to proclaim truth, offer hope, and actively contribute to building a better world.

Fr. Karel invited the community into deeper reflection through guiding questions: If to be prophetic is to critique and to proclaim, how have you been a prophet in your own life? What realities in our country and in the world have disturbed you, and how have you responded—have you spoken out, denounced, or shared these concerns? More importantly, how have you proclaimed hope? What vision of a better world have you announced, and how have you contributed to making it possible?

He further asked: How has God formed you into this prophet, and how does God continue to form you today? In what ways is God preparing you to stand for justice and peace, to work for the common good, and to be in solidarity with others? These questions serve as a continuing invitation to recognize the graces we receive and to respond courageously to the call to be prophets of hope.



The day concluded with a Holy Mass, also presided over by Fr. Karel, bringing together the themes of reflection, calling, and community in a sacred moment of communion. Altogether, the three events—the Way of the Cross, the reflection session, and the Holy Mass—beautifully embodied Miriam College's Lenten tradition of deep spiritual engagement. They reflect the institution's core values of faith, service, and social responsibility, reminding the community that Lent is not only a time for personal reflection, but also a call to transformative action rooted in justice, peace, and love.

KATHERINE CHLOE S. DE CASTRO

Hon. Katherine Chloe “Kat” Sinsuat De Castro is a woman relentless in her pursuit of truth. Her journey to becoming the first female **Director General of the Philippine Information Agency (PIA)** is a testament to this.

After finishing high school in 1995, Kat pursued a degree in Communication at Miriam College (Batch 1999). She recalls how tight-knit the community was, making it inevitable to form friendships across different programs—many of which have endured through the years.

Kat also reflects on how the community nurtured their passions through shared classes, including her former classmates Juris Fernandez and Nina Girado of MYMP, who have since distinguished themselves in the music industry.

Her years at Miriam College helped shape her into a person of integrity—one who stands for truth above all. This is one of the core values she carried with her as she embarked on her professional journey.

Kat followed in the footsteps of her parents and started as a news reporter for ABS-CBN, with a focus on the terrorism beat. She recalls covering stories across various parts of the Philippines and abroad, and her steadfast refusal to compromise her reporting standards, which earned her the respect of her peers.

Her advocacy for transparency found a steady home in the field of development communication. In 2024, Kat assumed the role of Director-General of the PIA. Today, she continues to play a crucial role in bringing news and information closer to the Filipino people: “We make sure that even the farmer, the simplest folk, the simplest Filipino, even those living in far-flung barrios, understand what the government is doing for them in times of crisis.”

For this reason, Kat believes that her servant-leadership role at PIA—and being the first woman to hold this position—is her most fulfilling accomplishment. More than titles or milestones, however, she takes greatest pride in being able to pursue what she is most passionate about.

Learning—especially a Miriam education—never stops for Kat, as reflected in her continuing commitment to excellence in public service.

She has been enrolled in the Master of Integrated Marketing Communications program at Miriam since the previous year.

Kat hopes that more graduates from Miriam College will consider careers in public service. Her advice for Knollers who wish to lead as public servants is to stay true to the community’s core values: “Please make sure na hindi ka magpapakain sa sistema (that you will not be consumed by the system),” she emphasizes. “Whatever Miriam College instilled in you when you were still a student, make sure you carry it with you when you enter government service. And [...] if you are able to uphold integrity, truth, and justice, then [...] you can bring about meaningful change in government.”

For Kat, a Miriam graduate is resilient: “You can throw us in whatever industry, we will survive and come out on top.”

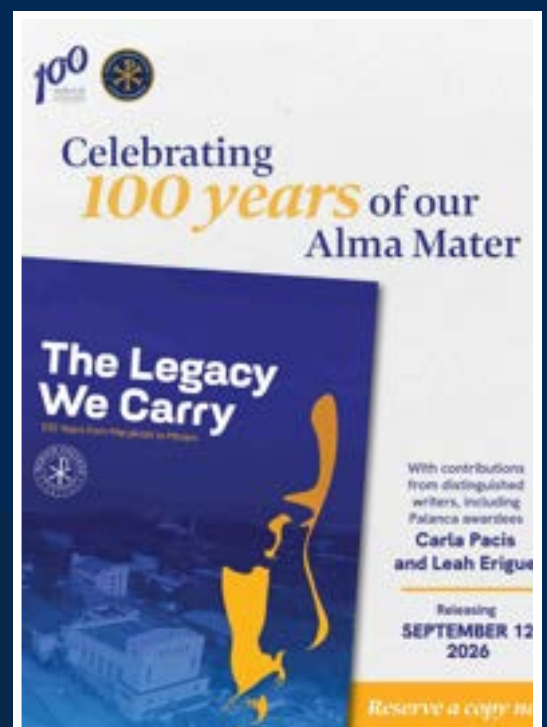

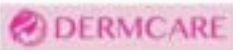

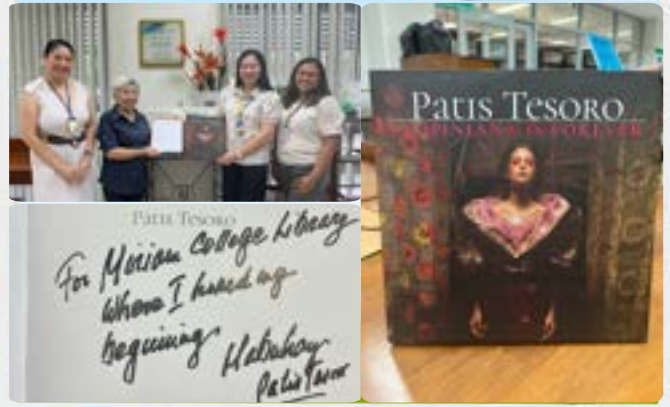
