

Rape Culture is a general term for any culture in which rape, sexual violence, and other sexist, misogynistic, homophobic, or transphobic beliefs and behaviors are normalized and not challenged.

> Rape, incest, battery, domestic violence, hate crimes, murder

EXPLICIT VIOLENCE

Sexual coercion, covert condom removal, stalking, revenge porn, dick pics, up-skirt photos, non-consensual exposure, leering

REMOVAL OF AUTONOMY



Harassment, threats, verbal abuse, sexist, homophobic, transphobic jokes, rape jokes, locker room talk, victim-blaming, cat-calling

VERBAL **EXPRESSIONS**

Traditional gender roles, glass ceiling, unequal pay, normalization ("boys will be boys"), objectification and oversexualization, stereotyping

ATTITUDES AND **BELIEFS**











BELIEFS THAT ENCOURAGE SEXUAL AGGRESSION AND SUPPORT VIOLENCE **AGAINST WOMEN,** WHETHER OVERTLY OR **COVERTLY**



BELIEF IN BIOLOGICAL DETERMINISM, OR THE BELIEF THAT SEXUAL AGGRESSION IN MALES AND SEXUAL PASSIVITY IN **FEMALES IS THE NORM**



INACCURATE IMAGES OF VIOLENCE AS A NATURAL PART OF SEX IN MEDIA, IN PORNOGRAPHY, AND **ELSEWHERE**



HIMPATHY, OR **INAPPROPRIATE SYMPATHY RECEIVED BY THOSE WHO** PERPETUATE MISOGYNY AND **COMMIT ACTS OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE, USUALLY EXPRESSED AS EXCUSES FOR PERPETRATORS**









BELIEFS THAT RAPE IS AN EXPRESSION OF SEXUAL DESIRE, RATHER THAN ONE OF POWER, **CONTROL, OR ANGER**



VICTIM BLAMING, OR **HOLDING SURVIVORS OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE RESPONSIBLE HAVING EXPERIENCED SEXUAL VIOLENCE**



LITTLE TO NO JUSTICE FOR SURVIVORS OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE, AND LITTLE TO NO **CONSEQUENCES TO** PERPETUATORS OF SEXUAL **VIOLATIONS**



THE PROMOTION AND PERSISTENCE OF RAPE MYTHS, AND FALSE OR BIASED **INFORMATION ABOUT THE** RAPE, RAPE SURVIVORS, OR RAPISTS TO DENY THAT **INSTANCES OF FORCED OR COERCED SEX ARE RAPE**







THE MYTH OF MARIA CLARA: Among the many cultural images that make up rape myths and contribute to rape culture, the image of Maria Clara may be one of the most pervasive and iconic. Maria Clara is a model for Filipinas — meek, subservient, passive, and beautiful.

HETERONORMATIVITY: Heteronormativity assumes that heterosexual relationships — those between males and females — are 'normal,' and that everything else is irregular or an aberration, a disease that must be cured









How does Rape Culture manifest in the Philippines?

Despite being internationally acclaimed as one of the most gender equal countries in the world, the Philippines hides in its underbelly a cultural foundation that lends itself to rape culture.

VICTIM BLAMING: Victim blaming is holding a survivor responsible for having been assaulted. This extends to comments or questions about a survivor's clothing, their being drunk or high, their being out and about at night or in dangerous areas, their relationship with the perpetrator, or their occupation

MACHISMO: Machismo is the idea that rehearsed, flaunted, and in most cases, exaggerated displays of masculinity (often as a point of pride and identity); and derogation of anything associated with femininity are acceptable, and expected male behavior.

"BOYS ONLY" CLIQUES: These are groups of young males where members consciously or unconsciously rehearse and seek validation of their masculinity. Because these groups expressly exclude girls and boys that members perceive to be "different" from and "beneath" ALLOWED them, these groups tend to be echo chambers of toxic masculinity. Their exclusionary nature can prevent members from growing well-adjusted to more diverse environments.
